Conference: The Linguistics Society of India (LSI) held its 44th International Conference of Linguistics Society of India (ICOLSI-44) at the Centurion University of Technology and Management Odisha, Bhubaneswar, from 24-26 November 2022. All faculty members shared the responsibility of the entire organization and conducted the conference very efficiently. The Conference was a grand success. A total of 231 were received, and 205 were accepted. Finally, 205 papers were presented. Prof PK Pandey has delivered a lecture in memory of Prof Radhabai Katre. In addition to it, seven other Spl lectures were delivered by the invited speakers from India and abroad.

The society's annual executive meeting and 67th annual general meeting were also held during the conference in November 2022. The minutes of the meetings are circulated and available on the website at lsi.org.in.

Publication: Indian Linguistics Vol. 82 for the year 2021 was released during the conference at ICOLSI-44. We thank Prof. Umarani Pappuswamy, the Editor of Indian Linguistics, for the publication of the volume. The volume was published with the financial assistance received from the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi, and was printed in

Pune. We are thankful to the Director, Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi for the grant of Rs.1.80 Lakhs for the maintenance and Rs.2.25 Lakhs for the publication of Indian Linguistics for the year 2022-2023. (For the years 2021-22, the numbers were 1.80 lakhs and 1.62 lakhs, respectively, for the maintenance and publication).

The Secretary is grateful to all the office-bearers and members of the Executive Committee of the Society, including the President, Prof. Uma Maheshwar Rao, for their constant support in the working of the Society.

I also thank Prof. Umarani Pappuswamy, the Editor of Indian Linguistics, for publishing the Society's journal in two parts, numbers 1-2 (January –June) and numbers 3-4(July-December) for volume 83 of the year 2023, which was released at the inaugural session of the ICOLSI-45 held at AMU. We thank all the authors for contributing to the journal; without them, the journal would not have come out.

The website of the Linguistic Society of India now holds all the volumes of *Indian Linguistics*. The entire set of volumes is reorganized into individual articles in terms of the names of the authors and titles of the articles. Now, they are searchable by article and by author names and readily made available for download on some payment. However, the online payment facility is still waiting for permission from the Reserve Bank of India.
